

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I pray this note finds you doing well and having a wonderful summer. As is always the case, this time of year finds Reveille busy as ever, working hard to fulfill our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Whether we are building or repairing houses on the Eastern Shore or in Winchester, saving lives in Honduras, instructing children at Kids Camp or Vacation Bible School, or singing God's praises at *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, Reveille people are combining time, talents, and resources to enable life-changing missions to happen here and around the world.

And yet, while not all people are called to participate in a mission trip, each of us is called to be in mission. To discover where to begin, we need not look further than our own membership vows:

Prayer: Perhaps the most important of our membership vows is also the easiest to overlook. Our prayers for our church and its ministries are essential, as they are the primary way God has given us to connect with the Divine in our midst. This summer, I am asking you to make sure you pray daily for our church.

Presence: To say that "everything slows down in the summer" is a misnomer. As I listed above, many important ministries are happening in these hot weather months, and of course, worship does not stop! We are better when we worship together, for the Spirit weaves together our voices into a mighty chorus of praise to our Savior. This summer, I am asking you to be present in worship when you are in town and to visit another church when you are traveling.

Gifts: In Psalm 116, the psalmist asks, "What can I give back to God for the blessings poured out on me?" Our combined generosity assures that life-changing ministry is able to happen in our community, region, and world. What

we give may sometimes seem insignificant to us, yet in the hands of Christ our gifts become loaves and fishes multiplied in abundance, rendered into ministries that allow worship, growth, and service. This summer, I am asking you to continue your financial support of Reveille and its mission (see [page 13](#)).

Service: Jesus reminds us that "the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve." Servanthood is the natural posture of a disciple of Christ. As always, our bulletin, newsletter, weekly emails, and website are filled with opportunities for us to serve others. This summer, I am asking you to find a way you can use the gifts and skills God has entrusted to you to bless someone else.

Witness: When we live our membership vows, they combine to form our witness to the world. Jesus reminds us that "a tree is known by its fruit." How we live our lives is what is in our hearts made visible for all the world to see. This summer, I am asking you to find a way to share your faith with someone else. It can be as simple as inviting a friend to church with you.

Your church needs you. Reveille is a 12-month congregation whose ministries affect positive change in people's lives throughout the year, and we cannot be the kingdom people Christ is calling us to be without being a part of his gathered community that he calls his church. Likewise, you (and I) need the church in order to worship, to grow, and to serve in ways we could not if we were trying to do this holy work alone. I thank each of you for the myriad ways you live out the promises you have made to God and one another as members of Reveille United Methodist Church, and I look forward to what God is doing next.




the more graceful moments of the story. As you might guess, though, the singing by everyone in our amazing Youth Choir will likely steal the show!

On May 9, six Reville members gathered with their new sister, “AC,” around the dining room table in the Hampton-Downs home to break bread, share life stories, and officially begin a year’s journey together as a family. Reville members, Judi Denny, Bob Downs, Angela Elliott, Rob McAtee, Mary Michael Schweiker, and Ellie Speer trained specifically to work with someone like AC, who is a youth aging out of the foster care system.

Most of us have had the benefit of family who have been there to give advice, encouragement, moral support, and much more. We may have had multiple mentors throughout our lives. That is not the case for many youth in the foster care system. Our table will be that family and those mentors for AC during the coming year as we help her discern and work toward positive, attainable goals.

Table members have quickly been immersed in medical, housing, employment, and transportation issues. One issue impacts another, and all together they may seem overwhelming. However, the beauty of Open Table is that AC not only has six table members with knowledge and life experiences, but she has the benefit of their friends, family, and associates, and all that they may offer and all of the knowledge and experience that our congregation may offer. A table member may contact you for your opinion on a particular challenge. Please keep AC and our table in your prayers.

COUNCIL Column

May 28 Meeting

News from Your Church Council

At the May 28 meeting, Church Council received an update from SPRC on the Director of Youth Ministries and Financial Administrator searches. Second round interviews of three candidates for the youth director position will take place Saturday, June 1. Interviews with candidates for the Financial Administrator position are ongoing.

The Council received a report on ministry goals submitted by each ministry area as part of planning for the 2020 church budget. These goals align with the church's overall focus for 2019-2020:

Reveille UMC will cultivate a culture of purposeful inclusion for all people by connecting to God through caring, learning, racial reconciliation, and worship arts.

The Council also discussed ways to address potential future financial shortfalls through efforts to increase revenue and trim expenses. It was noted that Reveille is in great shape financially, with no debt, a significant and dependable income from our endowment, and a congregation that is consistently and tremendously generous, contributing approximately \$1.1 million annually.

The Grow Team presented a summary of results from a MissionInsite report comparing demographic data of Reveille's congregation with that of residents in the area surrounding the church. The report showed that the greatest intersection between the congregation and local residents were the demographic groups including single adults, empty nesters, and older adults. Despite the age and life experience differences among these groups, there is great deal of overlap in the preferences of them, with educational and service/outreach activities being two areas where Reveille could focus efforts to attract new members from the local area.

The approved March Church Council minutes are now available. To review the document, please send a request to Terri Edwards, admindirector@reveilleumc.org. The Council did not meet in April. The approved May Council meeting minutes will be available following the next Council meeting.
