Not everyone can attend a mission trip across Virginia or around the world. Not everyone can help lead a ministry like Vacation Bible School. Not everyone can perform in a musical. However, without God's



blessing of our combined prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness, none of these ministries would happen. It is by your generosity of talents, finances, and time that we are able to be in ministry in so many places to so many people, and for each of you, I give thanks to God.

The word liturgy comes from the Greek leitourgia, which means "public service" and "worship of the gods." I find it fitting that the word we use for our worship is a word that combines our service and our God. When we work and worship together, we become a sign-act of God's kingdom on earth and agents of nothing less than God's transformation of the world.

### 2020 Budget Finding a Sustainable Path

Reveille is blessed with financial resources and faithful congregants. Our church has no debt. We currently have a large endowment which can provide a dependable income, thanks to the generosity of those saints who have gone before us. Most importantly, we are blessed with a congregation that is consistently and tremendously generous, contributing approximately \$1.1 million annually.

For the past several years, however, as a congregation we have not lived within our means. Our growth as a congregation has not kept up with the structures, staffing, and ministries we have cultivated to support such growth. Our total expenses have increased more than our revenue. Simply put, our costs for ministry have increased while our income has remained constant.

We have used reserves, designated funds, and past budget surpluses to continue to fund our staff and ministries at increasing levels. These budgetary fixes are not sustainable.



We are projecting a significant operating deficit for 2019. Preliminary projections show a larger and unsustainable operating deficit for 2020.

As such, Reveille will have to make changes in order to place our church on a sustainable financial path.

A 2020 budget task force has been formed to discern solutions and propose a plan to the Finance Committee and Council to address this issue. Ministry leaders and staff are working with the task force to review the preliminary 2020 budget line by line to find creative ways to reduce expenses or increase revenue. The goal is for all of us to work together toward a realistic and sustainable budget.

The budget task force, the Finance Committee, and your Church Council are committed to discerning with God's help the course of action which best preserves all of the work Reveille does to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Changes to aspects of our operations will be necessary; as giving and revenue increase, we hope to maintain and increase our ministries.

#### Swansboro Kids at Westview on the James

A week of camp successfully ended for 24 campers who were bubbling with excitement, laughter, smiles, and even tears on the final night because they had a perfect week at Westview and did not want it to end. The counselors could not

have been more complimentary of this group of campers with some counselors saying, "This was the best week of camp I have ever had."

The zipline, slide, and trampoline at the lake were at the top of many lists for favorite activities of the week with swimming in general being a camper favorite!

Because of our congregation's help transporting the campers to and from Westview, they were able to have a week of fun they could never have imagined and will never forget. ### Medical Care in the Mountains of Honduras

For more than a decade, Reveille's outreach programs have included an annual medical mission trip to Honduras through Friends of Barnabas. This year a team of thirteen, Lyn and Sarah Grace Clarke, Cary and Lily Gentry, Cathy and Megan Frank, Claire Kaugars, Walker Speer, Kim, Caroline, and James Daniel, and Chris and Charlotte MacBride, spent

an inspiring week at the Friends of Barnabas "Alfredo's House" in Pena Blanca and in the surrounding Honduran mountain communities. For some volunteers it was their first mission trip to Honduras; for one, it was her ninth time serving in Honduras. Each team member brought valuable and sometimes unexpected gifts.

Our days started early and we visited five communities including Terreritos, Nuevo Lempira, Cardoncillo, Sam Ramon, and El Obo. Most of the villages included approximately 200 families, a lower school (no high school), and no health center. While all but one had potable water, some community members had to travel a considerable distance to access the well water. Many families used wood stoves for cooking and at least half had outdoor latrines.



Despite the challenging circumstances these Honduran communities face on a daily basis, we were greeted every morning by welcoming families. Community members of all ages helped the team unload, and at the end of the day reload, the many boxes from the bus which contained medicine, eyeglasses, dental equipment, flip flops, diapers, personal hygiene items, and fans. Team members rotated and shared responsibility for the pharmacy, dispensing vitamins and deworming medication, weighing and measuring younger children, providing fluoride treatment for children's teeth, assisting with adult and pediatric vision screening and eyeglass selection, performing blood pressure checks, taking photographs, and reassuring dental patients while a flock of interested but sometimes apprehensive children and adults tried to observe the dental care being provided (mostly tooth extractions). Several team members gave a special wooden cross necklace to a community member that touched them during the course of their week.

At the conclusion of the week, the team had seen 750 medical clinic patients, provided vitamins to 620, deworming to 365, fluoride to 181, assisted with 322 pediatric eye screenings and 186 adults eye examinations (including one or more pairs of glasses for each adult patient), examined 92 dental patients and performed 149 tooth extractions, and referred 102 individuals for further medical care. The week passed quickly and the gifts provided and learned in the service of others will hopefully stay with this team and in the Honduran communities we were privileged to serve much longer. *-Kim Daniel*

### Virginia 2019 Annual Conference Highlights

At the 2019 session of the Virginia Annual Conference, our theme was "Moving Forward in God's Mission" and our focus scripture was Matthew 28:18-20 wherein Jesus gives his disciples his Great Commission to go and make disciples. Our presiding bishop was Peter Weaver.

This year was what is commonly called a "voting year" because we were tasked with electing lay and clergy delegates to the quadrennial meetings of the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference and the 2020 General Conference, which take place in July and May of next year, respectively.

The primary task of the Jurisdictional Conference when it meets at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina, is to elect and assign bishops throughout the southeastern United States. The General Conference is the global gathering of clergy and lay delegates from around the world. It is the only body who can create and amend church law, and it is the only body who speaks for The United Methodist Church. The 2020 gathering of the General Conference will be held in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The General Conference met in an unprecedented special called session in St. Louis in 2019 to deal with matters of LGBTQ inclusion in our church, specifically same gender weddings and the ordination of LGBTQ clergy. The result of this meeting was the passing of the Traditional Plan, which strengthened longstanding existing prohibitions against same gender weddings and the ordination of what it terms "homosexual" clergy.

In this year's elections, the membership of the Virginia Conference elected 11 clergy and 11 laity to represent us at General Conference, and the same number to represent us at Jurisdictional Conference. An additional 10 clergy and 10 laity were elected as Conference alternates. However, it is important to remember that the first alternates to General Conference who could be called upon to serve at General Conference are those who were elected to Jurisdictional Conference.

Reveille member Jill Gaynor was elected as a delegate to General Conference, and Reveille member Maureen McKay was elected as the seventh alternate delegate. I was elected as a delegate to Jurisdictional Conference and will serve as the second alternate delegate to General Conference, which means Jill and I will both be attending the 2020 General Conference, although unless two people have to

withdraw, I will not be a voting delegate.

In the Virginia Conference our session was a clear response to the outcome of the 2019 General Conference. With the exception of one lay alternate delegate, everyone elected on both the clergy and lay sides were individuals who seek a more inclusive church than the Traditional Plan allows. This is not surprising, as it somewhat reflects how voting broke down across geographic lines at the 2019 General Conference, with many delegates in the United States seeking a more inclusive church than some delegates from other parts of the world. This demonstrates the challenges of being a denomination that seeks to do ministry in very different cultures and contexts around the world.

Last week, the Virginia Conference also overwhelmingly passed motions that would remove from our church's Book of Discipline language that describes "the practice of homosexuality" as "incompatible with Christian teaching." As such, this will be among the many pieces of legislation considered by the General Conference when it meets next year.

The session in Roanoke was not merely about matters of LGBTQ inclusion. We also celebrated our clergy retirees, honored lay and clergy members of the Annual Conference who have died in the last year, including Reveille's own Rev. Reg Potts. We licensed, commissioned, and ordained new clergy. We officially "fixed" or set new pastoral appointments, including the return of myself, Rev. Kelley Lane, and Rev. Stephen Coleman for another year of ministry at Reveille. We heard reports, passed budgets, and rejoiced at God's work in ministries around the Conference.

Please keep Reveille, the Virginia Conference, and The United Methodist Church in your prayers. Please pray for the delegations attending General and Jurisdictional Conferences. With the great honor of election comes tremendous work and responsibility, and we need you to help us to be, say, and do what God is calling us to in the months ahead.

Most importantly, I want to thank you for being the church in the world in all you say and do, and for in the good work you do each day that witnesses to the action of God in our midst. It is an honor to be your pastor and a joy to be your partner in ministry.
