As you certainly know by now, Bishop Sharma Lewis has projected the Rev. Dr. Peter Moon to be Reveille's new lead pastor. Pete currently is serving us as the Richmond District Superintendent, where he has served since 2015. Immediately prior to his cabinet work, he served for 12 years at Woodlake UMC, which is a large congregation in the Richmond District. Reveille also happens to be the church that sent Pete into ministry, as this was his church while he was a student at Union Presbyterian Seminary. Bishop Kern Eutsler baptized one of Pete's children in our sanctuary.

I have known Pete long enough that I cannot remember meeting him, at least 14 years. We served for six years together on the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. I

once led a staff retreat for him while he was at Woodlake, and of course, he has been my District Superintendent for the last five years.

Throughout the time I have known Pete, I have always found him to be an excellent preacher, a decisive and empowering leader, and a warm, humble, thoughtful provider of pastoral care. I cannot overstate the extent to which his shepherding of the Richmond District has impacted, for the good, my ministry with you at Reveille.

Pete will serve Reveille exceptionally well. God has richly blessed us with this appointment. In fact, when Bishop Lewis asked me to join her Bishop's cabinet, I was emphatic that she give the utmost care to choosing my successor, and I have the fullest confidence that she has.

Peter Moon was born in Nashville Tennessee, and was raised in Rockville, Maryland. He graduated from the University of Washington in Seattle with a degree in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering. Following graduation, he served as a Naval Flight Officer aboard the aircraft carriers USS Kitty Hawk and USS Ranger, flying A6E Intruder aircraft and

subsequently served as a flight instructor. In 1988, he left the U.S Navy to attend Union Theological Seminary (now Union Presbyterian) in Richmond, entering the ministry while a member of Reveille UMC. Since then, he has served multiple appointments in Richmond, Fairfax, Farmville, Woodlake, and most recently as the Superintendent of the Richmond District. He has also completed his Doctorate of Ministry at Wesley Theological Seminary, specializing in church renewal and revival.

Pete has served in multiple Conference leadership positions including the Board of Ordained Ministry and the founding Chair of the Five Talent Academy. Additionally, he has been a delegate to the past five General and Jurisdictional Conferences.



He and his wife Lynn have been married 32 years and have five children and three perfect grandchildren.

In his spare time, Pete enjoys running, cycling, woodworking, and fixing up old broken-down cars. When asked for a phrase that defines his ministry he replied, "In the person of Jesus Christ, there is no place where there is no hope..." He is a passionate believer in our God "who is able to do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine..." (Ephesians 3:20)

February 25 Meeting Council Column

At the Church Council meeting on February 25, the Council approved the nomination of Rich Schweiker as Church Council chair. Rich succeeds Kevin Bruny who recently stepped down.

The meeting discussion revolved around the Council's 2020 areas of focus, including:

Strategies to increase worship attendance:

• The Point service will soon have a different preacher than the 8:30 and 11:00 am services. This will allow greater flexibility for our clergy to engage with members and teach during the Sunday school hour. Preaching at The Point will rotate among Reveille's three clergy.

- From August 2 through September 6, the regular 8:30 and 11:00 am services will continue, but combined Sunday school will meet at 9:30 am in the fellowship hall, with music from CrossPoint each week.
- Middle school participation in youth ministries
- Several initiatives are underway to address declining middle school participation, including high school "buddies" for middle schoolers and transition events for fifth graders.





A Barmy Army

They say an army marches on its stomach. In England, the phrase barmy army is used in a lot of sporting arenas, but particularly with the England Cricket team. Check out the page on Wikipedia (<u>www.en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</u><u>Barmy_Army</u>) about that group of keen supporters. In English slang barmy can mean crazy, nuts, daft, etc. and it's often said you need to be a little barmy to go into youth ministry full time.

The youth ministry "army" may not march on its stomach, and while there is an element of barmy about some of us (pauses to look in the mirror....), everything we do is only possible thanks to the army of volunteers who get involved in youth ministry, either for a one-off activity or on a weekly basis. As we prepare for the New York trip this summer we have 10 adults lined up to travel. There were four of us on the ski retreat, and on any given Sunday there are between six and eight adults across youth Sunday school and youth group. The opportunities are definitely out there for adult involvement in youth ministry.

Is it challenging? Yes. Does it help you grow in your faith, both by serving and searching alongside teenagers? Yes. Is it filled with fun and games, as well as serious and deep conversations? Yes. Do you need to be particularly trained or gifted? No. Do you need to be slightly barmy? No, but sometimes it does help! Do you need to simply be you and be present? Yes.

There is no "secret" to volunteering in youth ministry, no magic formula, other than being yourself, being present and being open about your faith, including when appropriate, your struggles to follow Christ.

So while I do want to thank the two dozen or so folks I can think of who have been or will be involved in my first 12 months here at Reveille (by the time we get back from NYC), I do also want to extend an invitation to more of you to get involved. Whether it be on a one-off visit or regular involvement, get in touch. Let me buy you a coffee and chat. No commitment, no barmy required.


