Swansboro Partner Churches History: Timeline 2013 - 2023

Introduction:

After 10 years of successful partnership, the members at Reveille United Methodist Church, Koinonia Christian Church, and Love Center of Unity decided to document the key events that allowed the joint ministry to flourish. Content for the timeline 2012 - 2023 was primarily sourced from oral history interviews conducted with 17 members from the three partner churches as well as newsletters, meeting minutes, event programs, and photos. More detailed information about the contributors can be found at the end of the timeline document.

2012

Summer

• Under the leadership of senior pastor Jim Noland, Reveille committed funds (\$100k) to build a Habitat House in the Swansboro neighborhood.

Reveille youth director, Dwayne Stinson, proposed redirecting resources typically
allocated towards out-of-state summer trips for youth to instead focus service efforts in
the local Swansboro community in hopes of allowing both adults and youth to minister
together to create future opportunities and relationships that would continue long after
the youth trip.

Fall

- Katie Gooch took the GRTC bus to Swansboro to explore the area. She attended a
 neighborhood association meeting outside of Koinonia, met Keith Edmonds, and invited
 him and his congregation to join in the Habitat for Humanity build.
- Sheelagh Davis and Gail Bosta tasked with getting to know some of the churches in the Swansboro community due to the 14 year partnership with Swansboro Elementary. They called over 20 churches and received two return calls: Koinonia and LCU.

2013

May

 May 18: Reveille members invited to help with a community-wide Swansboro clean up day



 May 19: Reveille Mission Benefit Concert held with proceeds contributed to Swansboro ministries

June

 June 20: Reveille members and Swansboro community volunteers began work on the Habitat House, located at 3412 McRand Street. The homeowner and single mother of four children, Dina Harris, helped with the house in between her overnight shifts at the post office. Swansboro community members were also invited to volunteer at the Habitat House.



July

- July 14-19: Youth camp focused on ministry in the Swansboro community
 - Donations from the youth performance of *Jesus Christ Superstar* attendees went directly to the Swansboro ministry fund to aid in the Habitat House, building a community garden at Swansboro Baptist Church, and a neighborhood clean-up day.
 - Reveille youth participant, Emma Farmer, shared her perspective: "Working in our own community meant that we were able to not only make connections with the people we worked with, but keep them as well."



August

• Habitat House volunteers completed work on the home.

September

 September 11: Reveille's Wonderful Wednesday program, co-hosted with the CEO of Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity, dedicated to reflecting on the stories and experiences of building the home in Swansboro.

October

October 4: Swansboro Elementary School celebrated its 100th anniversary. Many
Reveille members attended the festivities to commemorate the 15-years of successful
mentorship at the school through the Micah initiative. Micah is an association for faith
communities to help children by providing volunteer service in the public schools. More

November

 November 2: Habitat House dedication ceremony with the Habitat family, Reveille volunteers, and Swansboro community members celebrating the partnership together. LCU's Larry Branch provided the dedication.



- Reveille leadership asked Koinonia and Love Center of Unity leadership how they could help their congregations. Keith Edmonds and Larry Branch made it clear that joint ministry from all three churches on behalf of the Swansboro community would create the most fulfilling partnership. This conversation set the tone for the future of the Swansboro ministry.
 - Jill Gaynor added her perspective on the nature of the partnership: "We've been very intentional the entire time to try to make sure that it's a balanced partnership and that we're not the big church trying to squash the little church or the white church trying to tell the black church what to do."

December

• The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

2014

January

- January 26: Swansboro Celebration Lunch for those who participated in ministry efforts in 2013
 - Members planned future ways to stay connected and further relationships in the Swansboro community

February

 Kathy Rainey and Sheelagh Davis, co-chairs of the Swansboro ministry, asked Koinonia leadership how Reveille and Koinonia could partner together in ministry. Koinonia recommended a music program for the youth. Volunteers from Reveille and Koinonia provided weekly piano and drum lessons to children at the church known as Musical Mondays.

 The goals of the partnership were "for each congregation to share its gifts and work together to bring God's kingdom to the Richmond community."

March

Koinonia and LCU youth visited Reveille for a joint youth game night

April

 Koinonia received a baby grand piano for music lessons, thanks to the generous donation by Bethia United Methodist Church in Chesterfield. Bethia identified the need from ClergyNet, a list-serve where United Methodist clergy shared information, including items churches may be trying to donate.

May

- Swansboro ministry leadership worked on long term plans to continue the piano lessons at Koinonia, raise money for a new roof at LCU's youth center, hold annual food drives, and host joint ministry events to benefit the Swansboro community.
- May 7: Reveille Mission Benefit Concert held with proceeds contributed to Swansboro ministries
- May 25: A few Reveille youth and adults attended worship services at LCU and received a warm welcome from the members
- Food drive held at Reveille to support the food pantries at Koinonia and LCU

June

- June 1: Koinonia hosted an end-of-year piano recital for all students who participated in lessons with Kathy Rainey, Mary Ann Ramage, and others from Reveille.
- June 24: Members from Koinonia joined Reveille in worship at The Point, a modern worship experience.
 - Keith Edmonds gave the final blessing in the service.
 - Reveille's Jill Gaynor and Sheelagh Davis shared how they were "blessed by their visit and felt that they had taken another step towards being in relationship with one of their partner churches in the Swansboro community."
- Keith Emonds shared a public note of appreciation to the members at Reveille for their love and support in regards to the music lessons and food drive. He thanked the members for having shown "what the love of Christ is all about."



July

- July 1: Doug Forrester began his ministry as Reveille's senior pastor.
- July 14: Kelley Lane began her appointment at Reveille as the Minister of Adult Ministries
- Food drive held for Koinonia and LCU food pantries
- Koinonia and LCU highlighted as "partner churches"
 - Reveille leadership shared how the "seeds have begun flourishing" and the attitude of giving and receiving began to evolve into a joint ministry with "a common bond - the love of Jesus Christ."

August

- The partner churches organized into teams to enhance the joint ministry, named the SPIRIT Team (Swansboro Partners Inspiring Relationships In Christ Together):
 - The Swansboro steering committee led by Sheelagh Davis, known as the SPIRIT Team Taskforce, was organized to assemble members to help with monthly ministry opportunities as well as when immediate needs arise. The taskforce included at least two representatives from each partner church:
 - Koinonia: Jackie Walker, Phyllis Bell, and Georgia White
 - LCU: Charita Branch and Alicia Taylor
 - Reveille: Kathy Rainey and Sheelagh Davis
 - Swansboro Steering Committee set out to meet monthly to plan future ministries in the Swansboro community
 - Music/Academic Tutoring Ministry, located at Koinonia and led by Kathy Rainey, was established to organize piano and drum lessons as well as academic tutoring and board games and crafts with students as they waited for their slotted music lesson.

September

- Reveille's Fall Focus: "Redefining Poverty: We're All Broke(n)"
 - Reveille hosted Wednesday night studies to discuss When Helping Hurts:
 Alleviating Poverty Without Hurting the Poor by Steve Corbett and Brian Fikker.
 The format included dinner, short videos, and small group discussions.
 - September 14: Dominic Barrett, Director, United Methodist Urban Ministries of Richmond and Shalom Farms
 - September 21: Reverend Benjamin Campbell, Director, Richmond Hill; author of Richmond's Unhealed History
 - September 28: Reverend Joseph Torrence, Minister to Youth and Church Relations, United Methodist Family Services, Richmond, VA
 - Swansboro ministry discussed the the pros and cons of implementing the model laid out in When Helping Hurts: Asset Based Community Development (ABCD)
 - Understand what issues the people in the community want to work on
 - Identify what strengths they already have
 - Work together to develop a plan to use their strengths to tackle the issues that are most important to them

October

- Coat drive held for Koinonia, LCU, and Swansboro community
- "Redefining Poverty: We're All Broke(n)" continued with participation from all three partner churches.
 - October 5: Lawson Wijesooriya, Executive Director, Blue Sky Fund
 - October 12: Reverend Glenn Rowley, Director of Justice and Missional Excellence, Virginia Conference UMC
 - October 19: Reverend Andy Jones, Director of Development and Communications for the Chalmers Center
- October 26: Partner churches hosted "Commit to Serve, Commit to Relationships" in response to the When Helping Hurts poverty study
 - Keith Edmonds preached at the joint worship service which took place at Reveille UMC. Liturgical dancers from Koinonia and musicians from all three churches helped to lead the worship.

November

- Mt. Horan UMC (Natural Bridge, VA), Mt. Pigsah UMC, and the Petersburg Cooperative Parish donated guitars to the youth at Koinonia for music lessons and practice
- November 23: Reveille and Koinonia attended Pastor and Church Anniversary for LCU




December

• The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

<u>2015</u>

January

- LCU held a "Raise the Roof" dedication to celebrate the new roof and renovated space for the youth center, thanks to the donations from Reveille and help from their congregation. Reveille members attended and joined in the celebration.
 - Reflecting on the partnership, Doug Forrester shared: "what was beautiful was how over time, starting really from the beginning, watching this relationship morph into a ministry with, not a ministry to or for."





March

- Food drive held for Koinonia and LCU food pantries
- March 19: In response to the joint study of When Helping Hurts, the partner churches all "felt God's call to build relationships with the people of Swansboro" and held a "What's Next?" meeting to make future plans for joint ministry
- March 22: LCU hosted a joint worship service for members from all three partner churches
- Koinonia's youth director, Toni Allen, received the Presidential Community Service Award for her work in joint ministry, Musical Mondays, and connecting the partner church youth groups.



April

- April 15: Swansboro Elementary School Choir and Reveille Children's Choir put on a joint concert with proceeds benefiting Swansboro ministries.
- April 25: A Rebuilding Together event allowed Reveille members to spend time in the Swansboro community as they helped rehabilitate homes of the elderly and disabled.



May

 May 17: Reveille Mission Benefit Concert held with proceeds contributed to Swansboro ministries, specifically for Swansboro children to join Reveille's summer youth camps

June

• June 7: Spring musical recital held for all piano, drum, and guitar students at Koinonia



 June 15-17: Reveille Kid Campers completed mission projects in Swansboro with the help of children from the community

July

• July 2: Koinonia, LCU, and Reveille met at LCU with representatives from the City of Richmond Police Department to address safety for African Americans when dealing with police.



August

August 19: Partner church family cookout was hosted to celebrate the joint ministry





September

- Koinonia's Toni Allen invited partner church members to help teach skills and share hobbies with Koinonia Girl Scouts. Reveille youth Hannah Sjovold helped Koinonia Girl Scouts to earn their art badges.
- September 20: LCU held a Family and Friends Day worship service with partner churches. Toni Allen and Kathy Rainey invited members to help with Musical Mondays. Several youth from Reveille (Anna Lyle Collette, Caroline Daniel, and Kate Sjovold) began offering violin lessons. Rob McAtee and Bo Bowden taught guitar while Cole Rainey and James Daniel taught drum lessons. While kids were waiting for their music lessons, Sheelagh Davis and Joe Ramage led games and tutoring sessions. Carol Ann Lea led crafts with the help of Kelley Lane.

October

- Partner churches worked together to arrange monthly food deliveries from Goochland's Shalom Farms to Koinonia and LCU food pantries
- October 11: Baking for Bibles
 - Reveille's third graders held a bake sale and used the proceeds to purchase Bibles and Christian storybooks for distribution through Koinonia's food pantry
- October 17: Partner churches participated in Reveille's Day of Service. As part of the event, they decorated cake boxes for the Fall Festival Cake Walk at Swansboro Elementary and created encouraging cards for the Koinonia and LCU food pantry clients.



December

• The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

January

Food drive held for LCU and Koinonia food pantries

February

- LCU made plans to host youth services twice a month and invite youth from Reveille and Koinonia.
- February 3: Strong Men and Women of Virginia Event, sponsored by Dominion Energy and The Library of Virginia, was attended by members of partner churches.



 February 17-March 23: Members of all ages from the three partner churches met at Reveille during the six weeks of Lent for dinner and a study on prayer facilitated by leaders of all three churches.

March

 March 1: Reveille's United Methodist Women's general meeting featured guest speakers Lynette Branch from LCU and Phyllis Bell from Koinonia to share the history of their churches' roots and beliefs



- March 13: LCU hosted a joint worship service for partner churches
 - According to one Reveille member, the service was "bursting with praise and love."

April

- April 13: Swansboro Elementary and Reveille Children's Choir put on a joint concert with all proceeds benefiting Swansboro ministries.
- April 16: Reveille yard sale and youth bake sale donated proceeds to Swansboro ministries.

May

 May 7: Koinonia and LCU invited Reveille members to join in a work day at Shalom Farms in Goochland.



- May 22: Annual Mission Benefit Concert held with proceeds contributed to Swansboro ministries.
- May 28: Koinonia held a special service: "Uniting Church and Community through Fellowship" followed by a cookout for partner churches

June

- June 19-24: Reveille sponsored 25 children from Swansboro Elementary to attend Westview on the James summer camp. This included some children from Koinonia and LCU partner churches.
- June 29: Reveille Kidz Campers (rising 3rd 6th graders) delivered flower pots to members of the Swansboro community.
- June 30: Katie Gooch departed Reveille as executive pastor to go to her new appointment as Director at the PACE Center, VCU's United Methodist Campus Ministry.

August

- Sheelagh Davis stepped down as the Reveille Swansboro ministry champion and Jill Gaynor moved into the role.
- August 15: Partner church cookout held at Reveille with over 80 attendees from the three congregations



October

- October 9: Baking for Bibles
 - Reveille's third graders held a bake sale and used the proceeds to purchase
 Bibles and Christian storybooks for distribution through Koinonia's food pantry

November

• November 6: SPIRIT Team members attended LCU's anniversary service



- November 27: SPIRIT Team members attended Koinonia's anniversary service
- Reveille held a school supplies and clothing drive for Swansboro Elementary to help with the school's new "Dress for Success" initiative.
- Reveille Weekday School provided Thanksgiving baskets for families at Swansboro Elementary School.

December

- December 21: Reveille members were asked to bring canned foods to the Wonderful Wednesday meal to support the January food drive for the LCU and Koinonia food pantries.
- The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

2017

January

- Food drive held throughout the month of January for LCU and Koinonia food pantries.
- January 28: Reveille hosted a Knockout Hunger 3-on-3 basketball tournament to collect items for the food drive. Non-perishable food donation was required for entrance.

February

- February 1: Strong Men and Women of Virginia Event attended by members of partner churches
- February 5: Dr. Melvin Ely, Reveille member and professor of history at William & Mary, held a Sunday school program about African American history and race relations in preparation for the dialogue series with Swansboro partner churches.
- February 8, 15, and 26: "Welcome One Another as Christ has Welcomed You: Dialogues on Race Past, Present, and Future"
 - February 8: Rev. Benjamin P. Campbell, author of Richmond's Unhealed History presented at the first race relations discussion.
 - 140 attendees from the three partner churches
 - February 15: Larry Branch from LCU gave a talk titled "Present Climate of Race in our Country."
 - 120 attendees from the three partner churches
 - February 26: Youth and adult workshops titled "Our Future Being the Church Together" held in addition to a worship service led by the pastors of the three partner churches (Larry Branch, Keith Edmonds, and Doug Forrester).
 - Doug Forrester at Reveille encouraged members to get involved in the Swansboro partnership: "Momentum is so difficult to build and so easy to lose, and if this moment is to persist, then it is up to us, the people of Reveille, Koinonia, and LCU to make it so."
 - Sheelagh Davis acknowledged the successes as well as the barriers with the partner churches by sharing: "...we are conscious of an unspoken divide between us, due to historical injustices, fear of a different culture, and geographical separation." She encouraged all to participate in the 3-part dialogue series on race in order to improve relationships and understanding with the partner churches.
- February 12: Partner churches invited to celebrate Keith Edmonds' eighth pastoral anniversary held at Koinonia

March

As a result of the discussions on race and poverty, Reveille leadership shared the
following: "We need to discern what the needs are of the people we serve, especially in
Swansboro, so that we are not simply doing what we think needs to be done, but
developing relationships with the people we serve, so that we are truly meeting their
actual needs in our local missions."

April

April 26: Joint Swansboro Elementary School and Reveille children's concert

May

- May 10: Dialogues on Race follow-up dinner held to review the February sessions.
 - LCU's Lynette Branch led a worship service after the discussion focused on unity in the Swansboro partnership
- Jill Gaynor, Swansboro SPIRIT Team leader, shared the feedback received from the
 Dialogues on Race and recommended the formation of five new joint ministry teams.
 Members were invited to sign up as volunteers for the new teams. 40 members signed
 up to help with the new joint ministry teams, and SPIRIT Team leadership worked to
 ensure each team had representation from all three churches and at least one team
 leader from each church:
 - Joint Prayer led by Sonya Thomas (LCU)
 - Joint Studies led by Kelley Lane (Reveille) and Michelle Edmonds (Koinonia)
 - Transportation Taskforce led by Lynette Branch (LCU) and Bob Downs (Reveille)
 - Joint Fellowship led by Carol Hampton and Wendy Malamphy (Reveille)
 - Joint Worship led by Chauncey Bell (Koinonia)
- May 21: Annual Reveille Mission Benefit Concert held with funds donated to the Swansboro ministry.

July

 July 15: Swansboro partner churches volunteered together at Shalom Farms, a regional food access and community development project. The mission of Shalom Farms is to ensure access to healthy food and help feed Richmond families in need.





- July 29: Prayer Tea at LCU
 - o Women joined up as prayer partners with members from other churches
 - LCU's Sonya Thomas expressed, "...how can you get closer to somebody than to pray?"



August

August 3: Swansboro partners family cookout at Byrd Park





September

• Reveille's Director of Children's Ministries, Tammy Tipton Nay, and Youth Director Elisabeth Sjovold began offering dance lessons at Musical Mondays.

November

- November 1: Special screening of the film In Our Words and a talk by director Cameron Harris. The documentary and conversation explored what it's like to be black and whether or not racism still exists.
- Reveille donated its used bus to Koinonia

December

• The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

- September 28-29: "Pastor for Pastors" Network Workshop hosted by New Sharon Baptist Church to discuss pastor/congregational relationships. Reveille members including Doug Forrester attended, at the invitation of LCU's Larry Branch.

October

October 7: Ellen Flicker, Communities in Schools (CIS) site coordinator for Swansboro
Elementary, gave a presentation about how the Swansboro ministry can partner with
CIS to benefit the church partnerships, the school, and the larger Swansboro
community. Reveille had entered into an agreement with CIS to support a full-time CIS
site coordinator at Swansboro Elementary for three years (July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2021).
This position was made full-time rather than a previously funded part-time position.
Funds came from Reveille's \$1M gift fund, totaling \$120k (\$40k for each of three years).

November

• Musical Mondays at Koinonia transitioned into "Marvelous Mondays" at Swansboro Elementary as part of the after school program for students. Volunteers from partner churches provide arts/crafts, games, and dance weekly.



 November 3: Members from all three partner churches and the greater Swansboro community came together to recognize and celebrate LCU's Larry Branch for 30 years of ministry.





December

- December 1: Joint bus trip with Koinonia and Reveille to attend a presentation of "Christmas Comes to Love" in Lynchburg, Virginia.
- The Swansboro Ministry was included in Reveille's annual Glorious Gifts program, which raises money to support outreach.

- February 6, 13, 20 and 27: Partner church series held at Reveille titled "Reconciliation: Crossing Racial Barriers One Relationship at a Time." The format included a meal and a presentation about the history and traditions of each partner church.
